FUNDING FOR PRIMARY SCHOOL - PE AND SPORTS - 2023/24

The "Sport Premium Grant" is devolved funding from central government. The funding must be used to make improvements to the provision of PE and sport ,for the benefit of pupils aged 5 – 11 years old, in the 2023/24 academic year. This crucial resource is designed to provide all pupils with practical tools and opportunities to develop healthy lifestyles. We are committed to using this capital to develop high quality PE lessons, ensuring that the improvements we make to the quality of PE and sport as a result of the funding are sustainable. Furthermore we will continue to build upon links with local schools and sporting organisations in order to provide great opportunities for involvement in sporting competitions for all our young people. St. Joseph's received a grant of £17,135 in 2022/23.

THIS IS WHAT WE DID: ACTION

- Further developed the outside area to build on the good work thus far so that more sport could take place in a wider range of activities:

 Reorganisation of the playground into clearer zones by sports provider, continued on from previous years target of making the most of our school grounds. Trees and planters and planting areas kept well maintained and tidy. Maintenance of playground surface. Site inspections carried out termly with our site manager.
- A whole school "sports day" which will link in with other subjects:

This was planned for and delivered in May 2023. Similar to previous years, the children in EYFS and KS1 were supported by Year 6.

• Continue with extracurricular sports and activities:

Sports And All led in delivering additional clubs during lunchtime, whilst maintaining high standards set out at lunch time for mid-day staff on the playground.

• Partake in more competitive sport:

We re-signed with the local School Games organisers, so were included in opportunities that they deliver and offer in the area. Through this opportunity we were able to compete in inter school tournaments and offer our children more opportunities than before. We continued to make links with Stockport County who offered a whole school assembly and training course on mental health/football training sessions with our Year 5 children.

• Extend work with outside agencies to enhance experiences for children:

Sports And All delivered staff CPD in PE and gave additional PE lesson advice to staff. They assisted with lunch time provision on the playground and also provided a coach to deliver team games, practise for upcoming events and have a wider impact on Physical Education, School Sport and Physical Activity.

IMPACT

By continuing to work with trained sports coaches and professionals we have been able to continue with the process of CPD for staff enabling them to offer a wider range of sports supported by professional coaches to share best practice. Teachers are more confident in delivering sports activities with their children and their knowledge has been enhanced and measured. We've been able to measure this through the use of CPOMS where we have identified a reduction in negative behaviour during lunchtimes. We still have work to do, but this has definitely had a positive impact.

The children have taken part in football, netball and athletics competitions against other Stockport and Greater Manchester schools. We will continue to develop and enhance opportunities and experiences and make the most of our links with local schools and sports organisations.

HOW WE NEED TO DEVELOP AND BUILD ON THE ACHIEVEMENTS SO FAR

For the next financial year (23/24) we want to continue to build on the excellent work we have undertaken to date. We will continue to use Sports And All who provide excellent high quality sports provision. They will be leading sports in school (PE and Games and extra-curricular activities, alongside teaching staff and mid-day assistants). New equipment will be purchased this year and our outside area will be further improved and maintained following the existing improvements this year.

We will continue to provide our children with opportunities to take part in competitive sporting action through maintaining links with local schools and organisations such as Stockport County. We will continue to attend successful local sporting events – Stockport Schools Cross Country, Manchester United Emerging Talent Programme Tournaments etc and endeavour to participate in additional inter school competitions.

To provide further knowledge and experience to existing members of staff we will seek to provide Forest School Training as we continue to develop our outdoor areas.

Alan Pickles (school volunteer) has been leading an internal project, with the support of our children, to develop the outside area for all key stages and work to further develop our own Forest School. This has seen a great improvement in the uses of outdoor areas such as the allotment and the KS1 play area.

We continue to invest in an app called P.E. Passport. This will enable us to track and monitor the pupils' assessments in PE and Sports, whilst giving us the opportunity to gather evidence and share pupil voices. This will help us have an impact long term and collect data which will give us a clear idea on who participates in PE, extra-curricular activities and will deliver clear data. This tool also provides lesson plans for across the school.

Our spending plan objective for 2023/2024 is to continue to improve the provision of PE and sport to benefit all children who are part of the school by focusing on 3 areas: Physical Education, Healthy, Safe & Active Lifestyles and Competitive Sport. Under each of these areas we will:

Physical Education

- Increase staff subject knowledge and confidence in PE with the provision of support from qualified sports coaches working with teachers to achieve high quality teaching and learning in lessons.
 - Ensure provision links with other subjects to contribute to pupil's overall achievement and their social, spiritual, moral and cultural skills.

Healthy, Safe & Active Lifestyles

- Facilitate and encourage activities at lunch and break times
- Deliver school-based health and wellbeing activities and intervention strategies to raise awareness
 of healthy, safe and active lifestyle choices.

Competitive Sport

- Provide a variety of inclusive competitive sport opportunities
- Meet the costs of attending inter school competitions to remove any barriers to participation
- Work with our collaboration of local schools to facilitate inter-school competitions providing further
 opportunities for children to participate in competitive sport and to build experience in roles such as
 pupil sports leaders.
